- You must be a current student, taking at least a half-time academic course load.

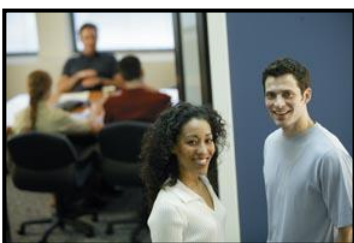
